With food insecurity affecting an increasing number of households across Orange County, your support has never been more important.



# Meet Shari & Harold Horne: Changing the Conversation Around SNAP

Shari Horne is a community leader and full-time caregiver for her husband, Harold, who is in hospice care. Like many seniors living on fixed income in Orange County, she relies on SNAP benefits (called “CalFresh” here in California) to help put food on the table.

When delays and uncertainty around SNAP began impacting households across the country in the fall, Shari chose to speak publicly about her experience. She shared her story with CBSLA and NBC4 to help address common misconceptions, reminding people that SNAP recipients include seniors, caregivers and working community members.

SNAP is the nation’s primary food assistance program and the safety net for many individuals facing food insecurity. For every nine meals SNAP provides, food banks provide one.\* At Second Harvest, we serve as the safety net to the safety net – stepping in when benefits are delayed, disrupted or simply not enough.

We are deeply grateful to Shari for lending her voice to this moment and helping our community better understand the realities facing many Orange County households today.

# Chef Tony's Spring Recipe

## Beautiful Bounty of Broccoli at Harvest Solutions Farm

Spring is bringing a fresh burst of flavor to Harvest Solutions Farm, especially broccoli! Knife Pleat's Chef Tony Esnault is celebrating the season with a delicious soup that lets this early spring star shine.

## BROCCOLINI SOUP | Yields 5 servings

### INGREDIENTS

- 3 heads of white cauliflower
- 2 cups diced white onions
- 3 tbsp. chopped garlic
- 3 tbsp. chopped ginger
- 8 cups thinly sliced broccoli
- 2 liters filtered water
- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil (optional)
- 1 tbsp. salt
- Additional broccoli, cabbage or cauliflower (optional garnish; please see notes below for preparation)

### EQUIPMENT

- 2 pots (with a medium to large surface area)
- 1 spatula
- 1 immersion blender

### DIRECTIONS

1. Start by gathering all your produce and equipment.
2. Clean and thinly slice the broccoli.
3. Dice the onions and rough-chop the garlic and ginger.
4. On medium heat, cook the onions, garlic and ginger. Add salt and cook until tender (about 5 minutes).
5. Next, add the broccoli and cook for 2 minutes while stirring until tender.
6. While the vegetables are cooking, bring the water to a boil in a separate pot.
7. Pour the boiling water over the vegetables and immediately blend with immersion blender until smooth. Next, add the olive oil if desired.
8. Enjoy!

**NOTES:** This delicious soup may be served hot or cold. Consider adding a garnish of blanched broccoli, cabbage or cauliflower; to prepare, cut into 1/2-inch diameter, cook in boiling salted water for about 2 minutes. Serve hot or cold.
